Helping Hands Update - \$5,000 Match:



Launched in January, Helping Hands is a program that provides funding for charitable purposes in our community. This program provides you and your family the opportunity to round up your monthly utility bill to help support rescue organizations, food banks, educational projects, child care programs and others. The Defiance Area Foundation will contribute \$5 per person up to \$5,000 to assist the program. As of the end of April, 343 utility customers have opted into the program. Please encourage your friends and neighbors to participate. There are several ways to

opt in: 1) visit the Defiance City Utilities website using the Helping Hands Opt-In Form (complete and submit electronically); 2) print the form and drop off to the Defiance City Billing Office; or 3) pick up and complete a form at the City Utilities office when you pay your next bill. You can Opt-In anytime!

The Defiance Dream Center exists to inspire hope and activate the talents hidden within each individual served so they can live out their God given purpose and make a difference in their families, communities and circle of influence. The strategies are designed to reach our community by building strong, meaningful relationships and meeting both the physical and spiritual needs of those served.

The goal of the Dream Center is to help provide a pathway of hope out of poverty, addictions, and hopelessness for people in need. Over the course of this past year The Dream Center has had numerous discussions with local community leaders and agencies to identify the most pressing needs in Northwest Ohio. The top three needs that have been stated time and again are transportation, a need for life-coaching/mentoring, and workforce development. The

Care Center, located at 1935 East Second Street is a multifaceted facility that is being renovated to address these three issues in our community. The Defiance Area Foundation grant will assist with the transportation needs at the Auto Care Center.

The Auto Care Center will focus on repairing and re-gifting vehicles of single mothers, widows and military wives with an actively deployed spouse. The Auto Care Center will not only meet the needs of the women served but through Life Coaching mentor/mentee relationships will provide job training for those unemployed and underemployed.
