What is an Acorn Fund?

“Dreams are the seeds of change. Nothing ever grows without a seed, and nothing ever changes without a dream.” ~ Debby Boone

An Acorn Fund is a seed that, with nurturing and time, grows into a much larger, permanent fund. The Acorn Fund gives individuals and organizations a simple and flexible way to build an endowment fund through the Foundation. Just start with \$1,000 and grow the fund from there. You may contribute any amount at any time, as long as the fund reaches the required minimum of the chosen fund category within 5 years. At the time the Acorn Fund is created, the donor will be able to choose the permanent fund type associated with their Acorn Fund. Fund types available are:

Unrestricted named fund—Leave a legacy in your name to benefit future generations. Minimum \$5,000.

Restricted named fund—Leave a legacy in your name and designate the income from the fund to a specific organization. Minimum \$10,000.

Field of Interest Fund—Created for the benefit of a specific field of interest (health care, the arts, education, etc.) Minimum \$10,000.

Restricted Endowment Fund—Created for the benefit of a specific charitable organization. Minimum \$10,000.

Agency Endowment— Created by a qualified charitable agency for the benefit of that organization. Minimum \$25,000.

Scholarship Fund—Created for the benefit of students pursuing a college education. Minimum \$25,000.

Donor Advised Fund—Allows the donor advisory privileges over distributions of the funds to charitable organizations. Minimum \$25,000.

When your Acorn Fund “matures” it will become a permanent fund and grant-making begins.

NEW FUND



Defiance Area Chamber of Commerce Foundation, Inc. partnered with the Defiance Area Foundation to create a Scholarship Program to benefit the chamber members, their employees, spouses, and dependents. This figure could represent over 20,000 people in our community. Over the years, and with the sale of their building, the Chamber Foundation will be seeding the fund with an initial \$25,000. This amount will ensure that we start with at least one \$1,000 scholarship in the first year. The goal is to grow this fund so that many scholarships will be awarded without touching the principle amount. It would be great in 20 years if 10 - \$1,000 scholarships could be given away. That would have a substantial impact on our Community.

This scholarship will not be restricted to any post-secondary school. This includes Associates, Undergraduate, and Graduate Programs. We believe that this will be the first of its kind. Please contact the Defiance Area Foundation or the Chamber office for more information.
